3 months	16"	14.5"/Small	4 oz
6 months	17"	15"/Small	4.5 oz
9 months	17.5"	15.5"/Small	4.5 oz
12 months	18"	16"/Med	5 oz.
18 months	19"	17"/Med	5.5 oz.
24 months	20"	18"/Large	6 oz
<b>Size Info</b>			
This pattern is written for newborn size with changes for 3m, 6m, 9m, 12m, 18m and 24m in brackets [ ]'s. Hat Pattern is written for Small (14"-15") with changes for Med (16"-17") and Large (18") in brackets [ ]'s.

<b>Special Stitches</b>			
Shell – 3 dc in same st Double Shell – (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in same st

## Supplies:

- Moda Dea Metro yarn (size 5 bulky weight)
- Size K crochet hook
- Needle for weaving in ends
- 3 Stitch markers
- 2 lengths of ½" organza ribbon

## Gauge (always be sure to check gauge):

**Row 1** – Ch 21, sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, \*sk 2 ch's, 3 dc in next ch, sk 2 ch's, sc in next ch, repeat from \* across. Ch 1, turn.

**Row 2-10** – Sc in same sc, \*3 dc shell in next shell, sc in next sc, repeat from \* across. Ch 1, turn.

**1 shells + 1 sc = 2 inches**

## Notes:

End of row counts are enclosed in –()-'s

## Yoke

**Row 1** – Ch 42[42, 42, 50, 50, 50, 50], dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook and in each ch across.  
–(41, 41, 41, 49, 49, 49, 49 dc)-

**Row 2** – Ch 2, turn, (counts as first dc now and throughout) dc in next 2 dc, sk 1 dc, sc in next dc, sk 1 dc, 3 dc in next dc (shell made), sk 1 dc, sc in next dc, sk 1 dc, \*shell in next dc, sk 1 dc, sc in next dc, sk 1 dc, repeat from \* across to last 3 dc, dc in each rem 3 dc. –(8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 10, 10 shells)-

**\*\*NOTE: Double shells count as 2 shells for end counts\*\***

**Row 3** - Ch 2, turn, dc in next 2 dc, sc in next sc, 3 dc in center dc of next shell, ch 1, 3 dc in same dc (double shell made), sc in next sc, \*shell in next shell, sc in next sc, repeat from \* across to last shell, double shell in last shell, sc in next sc, dc in last 3 dc. –(10, 10, 10, 12, 12, 12, 12 shells)- **MARK AS RIGHT SIDE**

**\*\*NOTE: Ch 1 sp of double shells counts as sc when pattern states to sc in next sc\*\***

**Row 4** – Ch 2, turn, dc in next 2 dc, sc in next sc, \*shell in next shell, sc in next sc, repeat from \* across, dc in last 3 dc. –(10, 10, 10, 12, 12, 12 shells)-

## **COMPLETE FOLLOWING RND ACCORDING TO SIZE**

**Row 5 (for newborn, 3m and 6m sizes only)** – Ch 2, turn, dc in next 2 dc, sc in next sc, double shell in next shell, sc in next sc, \*shell in next shell, sc in next sc, repeat from \* across to last shell, double shell in next shell, sc in next sc, dc in last 3 dc. –(12, 12, 12, --, --, --, -- shells)- **GO TO CAPE.**

**Row 5 (for all other sizes)** – Ch 2, turn, dc in next 2 dc, sc in next sc, \*(shell in next shell, sc in next sc) twice, double shell in next shell, sc in next sc, repeat from \* across, dc in last 3 dc. –(--, --, --, 16, 16, 16, 16 shells)- **9m and 12m sizes only: GO TO CAPE. All other sizes continue on to Row 6.**

**Row 6 (for 18m and 24m sizes only)** – Repeat Row 4. –(--, --, --, --, --, 16, 16 shells)-

**Row 7** – Ch 2, turn, dc in next 2 dc, sc in next sc, double shell in next shell, sc in next sc, \*(shell in next shell, sc in next sc) 3 times, sc in next sc, double shell in next shell, repeat from \* across, sc in last sc, dc in last 3 dc.  
-(--, --, --, --, --, 20, 20 shells)-

### **Cape**

**Row 1** – Ch 2, turn, dc in next 2 dc, sc in next sc, \*shell in next shell, sc in next sc, repeat from \* across, dc in last 3 dc. -(12, 12, 12, 16, 16, 20, 20 shells)-

**Rows 2-X** – Repeat Row 1 until cape measures 9"[10", 11", 12", 13", 14", 15"] from beginning. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

Weave organza ribbon through Row 1 of Yoke to tie in front.

## **Crown**

**Rnd 1** – Ch 4, sl st to form ring, ch 1, 16 sc in ring, join with sl st to first sc.  
–(16 sc)–

**Rnd 2** – Ch 1, sc in same st, sk 1 sc, shell in next sc, \*sk 1 sc, sc in next sc, sk 1 sc, shell in next sc, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to first sc. –(4 shells)–

## **COMPLETE FOLLOWING RND ACCORDING TO SIZE**

**Rnd 3 (for small size only)** – Ch 1, turn, sc in same st, shell in next shell, \*sc in next sc, double shell in next shell, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to first sc.  
–(7, --, -- shells)– GO TO HAT SIDE

**Rnd 3 (for med and large sizes only)** – Ch 1, turn, sc in same st, double shell in next shell, \*sc in next sc, double shell in next shell, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to first sc. –(--, 8, 8 shells)– Med size only: GO TO HAT SIDE. Large size continue on to Rnd 4.

**Rnd 4 (for Large size only)** – Ch 1, turn, sc in same st, double shell in next shell, \*sc in next sc, shell in next shell, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to first sc.  
–(--, --, 9 shells)–

## **Hat Side**

**Rnd 1** – Ch 1, turn, sc in same st, shell in next shell, \*sc in next sc, shell in next shell, repeat from \* around, join with sl st to first sc. –(7, 8, 9 shells)–

**Rnds 2-X** – Repeat Rnd 1 until hat measures 10”[ 12”, 14”] from side over top to other side. Fasten off.

Customization Option: You may customize the length of the hat side here by increasing or decreasing the amount of rows.

Weave in ends.

Tie ribbon in a bow around any sc from second to last row of Hat Side.
